

Holy Week, Our Last Push to Easter Celebrations!

We are getting so close to Easter but, before we can get there, it is important to understand the importance of Holy Week, the special liturgical days prior to the great celebration of Easter and how we can participate in them.



Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday and the liturgies are the most beautiful and expressive of our faith. Palm Sunday recalls the dramatic occasion when Jesus entered Jerusalem the week before he died. He came humbly riding on a donkey, yet he was acclaimed by the people as “Son of David,” therefore heir to the kingdom.

Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of Holy Week are days of physical preparation and where the idea of “spring cleaning” comes from. These days are for shopping and completing all the busy work to prepare for

Easter so that one can enter into the Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday) in a total spirit of prayer. **On Tuesday, April 15th at Holy Spirit, there is still the holy hour at 6:00 p.m. with the opportunity to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation.**


This is the last opportunity in the regular schedule to celebrate the sacrament in preparation for Easter.

Holy Thursday marks the feast day of the priesthood and of the Eucharist. The Mass of the Lord’s Supper is celebrated in the evening, **(7:00 p.m. at Holy Spirit)** and the celebrant washes the feet of people, representing the twelve Apostles whose feet Jesus washed at the Last Supper. At the end of Mass a procession takes the Blessed Sacrament from the main tabernacle to an altar of repose for a period of adoration of the Eucharistic Christ.



On Good Friday, the day Jesus died we gather **(3:00 p.m. at St. Mary)** to venerate the cross as a sign of our salvation and prayerfully enter into a spirit of deep appreciation for what Christ has done for us, suffering and taking upon himself our sinfulness. There are no praying of the Stations because the Veneration of the Cross at 3:00 takes the place of honor and focus. Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence.

During Holy Saturday the Church is quiet, the altar is bare for the Lord is not there! After sundown, **at 8:00 p.m.** the great vigil Mass of the Resurrection begins **(at Holy Spirit)** at the doors of the Church where a fire is kindled. The paschal candle is lighted and held high as it is carried into the Church. The light of Christ enters the world, the power of death has been overcome by our Lord and the joy of the Christian faith is in the air and the first “Alleluia” in forty days is sung.



Easter has arrived! Easter Sunday Masses, the same celebration as celebrated on Saturday night, are held on the regular Sunday schedule. ***Not a part of the Saturday liturgies is the blessing of Easter foods and baskets at each Church at 11:00 a.m.**

All of these wonderful liturgies can be forgotten if we do not attend some or all of them as a way to properly welcome the glories of Easter. Please try to schedule some time as a final Lenten push to prepare for Easter.

On Sunday April 27th the first Millennial Saint, Carlo Acutis, will be canonized in Rome. That same day, a movie about his life will be in theaters nationwide entitled *Carlo Acutis: Roadmap to Reality*. After learning more about the life of Carlo when my diocese named the chapel at our diocesan youth center after him, a family from the Diocese of Beaumont stepped forward to underwrite this film being produced by Wahl Street Productions and Castletown Media.

Bishop Andrew Cozzens and I would like to encourage the promotion of this film on the life and impact of Carlo Acutis for the youth of your diocese. For three days it will be shown in 945 theaters across the United States: April 27-29. Once the first 5,000 tickets are sold, the film has been guaranteed an additional three days in theaters. JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE BECKONS ALL CATHOLICS

The "2025 Jubilee Year: Pilgrims of Hope," declared by Pope Francis, is a rare opportunity for special graces. Father Michael Ruminski, the archdiocese's director of Divine Worship, attempted to demystify the "Jubilee of Hope" during a recent Theology on Tap event hosted by St. Bridget of Sweden Parish in Cheshire.

He answered three basic questions: What is a jubilee? What is the Jubilee of Hope? And how can we celebrate it well?

According to Father Ruminski, the term "jubilee" can be traced back to the Latin term meaning "to sound a trumpet." Its roots go back to Mosaic law in the Old Testament, when it was a special year of rest and forgiveness every 50 years.

In Old Testament times, the jubilee involved the forgiveness of debts, the release of indentured servants and the return of ancestral inheritance. "It was supposed to be a kind of resetting of societal obligations in which you begin again," Father Ruminski explains.

The jubilee was introduced into Catholic Church life by Pope Boniface VIII in 1300.

By 1500, jubilees were celebrated every 25 years. The Christian jubilee put greater emphasis on spiritual reconciliation: freedom from sin, forgiveness, and peace. Pilgrimages and plenary indulgences were added.

The current Jubilee of Hope designated by Pope Francis is focused on the virtue of hope and its importance in the modern world.

Pope Francis has identified people in need of prayers or visits, Father Ruminski notes, because they have lost hope: young families afraid to bring children into the world, young people fixated on drugs or technology, the forgotten elderly and the sick, migrants and refugees fleeing dangerous places, and forgotten prisoners.

Hope is essential, Father Ruminski says, in facing the challenges of the world and in proclaiming the message of Christ. "Hope is the virtue given to us by God to direct our expectations for the future," he says. "Without hope, we have no ability to face the future with confidence."

Instead of ruminating on our challenges, he suggests we "look at the world with the supernatural eyes of faith."

"As St. Paul says, 'hope does not disappoint,'" Father Ruminski reminds us. Rather than let the

problems of the moment "dominate us," we should "proclaim something of power to the world around us."

"It's the light of Christ, through his victory on the cross, that should direct the way we interact with each other," he explains, "for us to be able to live right, to be able to forgive well and to be able to proclaim Christ crucified and risen. And so we have to have hope in order to do that."

Other practical steps for celebrating the Jubilee of Hope include making pilgrimages to one or more designated cathedrals or basilicas: St. Peter's Basilica and the major basilicas in Rome or, closer to home, the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Hartford and the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception in Waterbury.

While there, pilgrims are encouraged to engage in the sacraments and acts of prayer: attend a Mass, go to confession, pray in adoration of the Blessed Sacrament or pray the rosary or the stations of the cross.

Conditions for receiving a plenary indulgence include confession, praying for the pope's intentions, receiving Holy Communion and being detached from sin.
