

FAQ’s Regarding the New Mass Schedule

Q. What if I have a mass intention for a time no longer available?

A. Mass intentions for St Mary’s for the 10:00am Mass will be moved to 10:30am, and those for the 7:30am and 9:30am at Holy Spirit will be moved to 9:15am. Those for the 11:30am will be moved to the 12:00pm Mass. Those for the 4:00pm @ St. Mary’s Mass should call the rectory office and inform them of the Mass time you would like it to be attached to. October (and May)—The Months of Mary



It has been a long-standing tradition that the months of May and October are dedicated to Mary, the Mother of God. Since Mother's Day is in May, and Mary is our spiritual mother and the mother of the Church, it is easy to understand why the Church would ask special attention be paid to Mary during that month.

The connection to Mary in the month of October is less obvious and may have started ever since 1571 when Mary's intercession was received and victory secured at the naval battle of Lepanto against the Turks on October 7th of that year. Today that special event is remembered as the feast day of Our Lady of the Rosary (October 7) because the victory of the battle was won after the praying of the Rosary.

To this day the months of October and May hold a special place for Catholics, especially in the praying of the Rosary. The Rosary as we know it was developed in the Middle Ages and at heart is a Biblical prayer, which is why scripture verses are often used for meditation with each mystery. When we pray the Rosary we pray the Gospels, all of the important events around the life of Jesus.

By tradition, not that it is a requirement, different mysteries are prayed on different days. The Joyful Mysteries are prayed on Mondays and Saturdays, the Luminous Mysteries are prayed on Thursdays, the Sorrowful Mysteries are prayed on Tuesdays and Fridays and the Glorious Mysteries are prayed on Wednesdays and Sundays. Other traditions include praying the Sorrowful Mysteries every day during the season of Lent or praying the Glorious Mysteries each day of the Easter Season.

Many have adopted the Rosary as a daily prayer as we go to our mother for guidance, intercession and encouragement as we live out our lives as followers of Jesus.
